My name is Dave Mayer and I am excited to coach the St. Catherine Track & Field team again this year. Track & Field will be available for K-8th grade at St. Catherine. We will practice on Friday afternoon's right after school at Maple Leaf Park from 3:20-4:30pm starting on April 21st and going through June 2nd. Pick-up from Extended Care is available. Each practice we will focus on three of the following track and field events including the 50 meter, 100 meter, 200 meter, 400 meter, 800 meter, relays, softball throw, long jump, turbo-jav throw and more.

The 4th-8th grade participants will have a second practice each week at a TBD time during the week with other local North Seattle Schools. I will have that information shortly as the final plan is developed. 4th-8th grade have the opportunity to participate in CYO meets competing against other schools on Saturday's May 6th, 13th, 20th and June 3rd (times TBD).
